


We are consistently a good school



Chesterfield High School is a mixed comprehensive school for 11-19 year olds. Our 1400 students come to learn each day in a fantastic school with state-of-the-art facilities.

The School is a fun and inspirational space with bright decorated classrooms, which provide a stimulating and lively setting for learning. Our ICT facilities include an Apple Mac media suite, interactive whiteboards, iPads, Apple TV's.

We also boast a well-stocked library, specialist equipment in science and technology, professional level dance and drama studios and a fully fitted theatre, worthy of our fantastic performing arts productions. Our extensive sporting facilities include a sports hall, tennis and basketball courts and acres of playing fields, which have contributed to the many successes of our young sportsmen and sportswomen.

Student Body Representation

Our student representative body ensures that every student has their say on issues around the school. Our head boy and head girl, along with other elected students, represent the 'student voice' on important issues such as uniform, catering and even interviewing new teachers. Alongside the school council, we have 'team potential' - aspiring young leaders who help to recruit trainee teachers.

Rewards

We believe that a rewards culture promotes and encourages maximum achievement. Students who demonstrate effort, dedication and a commitment to their studies can earn reward through our club 100 system, which allow access to enrichment activities. Teaching and Learning



Our expert and enthusiastic teachers bring learning to life by offering an inclusive, flexible and creative curriculum that includes a broad range of academic and vocational qualifications.

An exemplary assessment system, as well as individual support and encouragement, ensures that students frequently exceed challenging targets. Information and guidance are provided by a range of independent advisers, while intervention work tracks and mentors targeted students to help them achieve their potential.

Reading is core to pupils learning at Chesterfield. A dedicated reading programme ensures all students are able to access the full Curriculum. A well tailored intervention programme supports students to catch up and improve fluency.

Literacy & Numeracy

An important area of cross curricular work at Chesterfield High School is our whole school literacy and numeracy strategy - Locks and Keys. Developed by the school, our praised scheme ensures literacy and numeracy skills are embedded into every department and every lesson - not just maths and English. If you think that numeracy has nothing to do with art...think again!


Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural (SMSC)

We are particularly proud of our SMSC provision which cuts across the whole curriculum. Social, moral, spiritual and cultural topics and issues are woven into all lessons, helping students to develop a deeper knowledge and understanding of the wider world by learning about the beliefs, cultures, difficulties and needs of other people.

We're a Holocaust Beacon School

Chesterfield has recently been named a Holocaust Education Beacon School through the Centre for Holocaust Education. This is the only institution in the world to combine research into classroom needs with programmes specifically designed to enable teachers to meet those needs and challenges related to Holocaust Education

Chesterfield is one of only 17 Beacon schools in England who are committed to enhancing the teaching and learning about the Holocaust.





Chesterfield High School offers students the chance to take part in an even wider range of activities firmly focused on preparation for university life. The programme includes a range of high quality enrichment activities designed to inspire, motivate and, most importantly, challenge children to achieve their very best. Our More Able and Talented work enables students to work at a higher cognitive level to develop and draw out the extra skills and knowledge needed to achieve grades at level 8/9.

The Programme takes learning to the next level, challenging children to push themselves further, questioning, analysing and researching at a level beyond what is expected of them at GCSE, helping to prepare them for academic life beyond school.

British Values

Other important cross-curricular work is the promotion of British values - democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect and tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs. At the Academy students encounter these principles throughout everyday school life which are embedded into lessons and extra-curricular activities.

Achievement Through Partnership

The involvement of parents and carers in the education of children is widely recognised as one of the most beneficial ways to enhance success in school. Consequently, we welcome and encourage all aspects of communication between the school and parents and carers. We place great value on individual and regular contact. Our home/school agreement ensures that we achieve our targets in standards of work, behaviour and attendance. In addition, consultation evenings, email/text updates and termly reports keep you informed of your child's progress and welfare. Our Parent Carer Forum meets termly to give advice on the strategic development of the school.

Homework

We place great importance on the role that high quality, relevant homework plays in achievement. At Chesterfield High School, homework is seen as integral to learning and throughout the year, students are given carefully planned homework tasks that challenge them to work independently. All homework is on-line and can be monitored by parents so they are full aware of the independent study their child is completing.

From extra academic support, through to dealing with any worries or personal problems, we have the right people in place to help every child through difficult times.

We understand that for some students it's not always easy to go straight to a teacher for help, so we also have a 'peer support' system where students can confide in each other.

Transition From Primary School

Our warm and welcoming environment eases the transition from primary school, which we know can be a daunting prospect for some children. Our Summer School ensures that each new student has a friendly face to help them to feel safe and secure, and settle in quickly. There is also an early review meeting for parents in October so you can see first-hand how your child has adapted to life at the Chesterfield High School.

Chesterfield High School provides support for students with Special Educational Needs within a mainstream setting as outlined in the Special Education Needs Policy which can be viewed on our policy page.

This Special Needs Policy follows guidelines set by the Code of Practice from the DfE, in place since September 2014. This policy will be monitored and evaluated according to changes within the Code of Practice as and when they arise.

Our vision is to enable all our students to develop confident and independent learners in their time at Chesterfield High School in order to reach their full potential, whatever their ability and to be proud of their achievements at school and to be equipped to succeed in their lives in the future. Providing enrichment opportunities for students is a strength of the school and something that we are extremely proud of. A variety of clubs and activities take place daily at lunchtimes and after school. Students have the opportunity to take part in a range of opportunities both on and off the school site with students having the opportunity to travel abroad on various excursions.


