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THE SIXTH FORM **CURRICULUM**

The Sixth Form Study Programme

We aim is to ensure that all our students realise their true potential and are able to secure coveted places in the highly competitive world of Higher Education, apprenticeships and employment. University offers are based on a candidate's best three predicted Level 3 qualifications, with a minimum of ABB being required for many of the more competitive courses.

We therefore simply ask students to choose and focus on achieving good grades in 3 A Level or equivalent subjects.

A Level Subjects on Offer

With around 20+ subjects on offer in the Sixth Form, we're able to maintain flexibility in the choice of subject combinations. This will allow you to move successfully into the next phase of your chosen career.

Personal Learning

Chesterfield students also participate in Personal Learning lessons. You'll cover a range of topics under the themes of the Wider World, Healthy Lifestyle & Relationships. In addition to these lessons, guest speakers regularly visit, inspirational presentations and stories that support these Personal Learning themes.

Core Maths

Level 3 Mathematical Studies (Core Maths) is designed for students who have achieved a grade 5 or above at GCSE. It supports courses such as A-level Psychology, Sciences and Geography as well as technical and vocational qualifications by maintaining and developing real-life maths skills. What you study is not purely theoretical or abstract; it can be applied on a day-to-day basis in work, study or life.

A fourth A Level?

In a small number of cases some of you may opt for a fourth subject such as Further Mathematics at AS level as part of your Futures suite. This would most likely be to support a university application where an understanding of an additional field would be beneficial. Naturally we're here to advise and guide you on this.

FPO or Extended Project Qualification

The EPQ qualification, which is designed to develop creativity and curiosity, isequivalent to half an A-Level. Students embark on a largely self-directed project: You choose a topic, and then plan, research and develop your ideas and decide on your finished product. A project topic may be directly related to your main study programme, but should definitely look 'beyond the syllabus'!

Assessment

Communication

The relationship between yourself, your Sixth Form and home is very important. PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

These hugely popular Silver and Gold Award schemes play a very important part of many of our Sixth Formers' lives. A team of dedicated staff organise challenges, trips and expeditions. Students also undertake service components, which help them develop skills as team players and leaders.

Trips and Visits

Students at Chesterfield have plenty of opportunities to support and extend their studies and personal experience through the wide choice of trips and visits on offer to them during their time in Sixth Form. Recent visits have included New York, Cern, Austria, Poland, Paris, London and field trips across the country.

Wellbeing Wednesdays

Dedicated time is set aside for all Year 12 Students to participate in physical and mental wellbeing activities. These activities are voted for and chosen by students who then rotate to get a full and varied experience.

Sport

We're proud of our sport facilities, and our teams regularly compete at local, regional and national levels. We've an outstanding reputation for sporting success throughout the school as a whole - both regionally and nationally - and the Sixth Form is no exception. Sporting success and achievement helps to develop outstanding young men and women. We wouldn't have it any other way.

Student Ambassadors

Student Ambassadors have the opportunity to influence the activities and social time organised for students. They represent the 6th Form at Parent's Evenings and help students lower down the school. They also will have a pivotal role in organising events like the Year 13 Prom.

Active Citizenship The vast majority of our students take part in some form of active citizenship. This is a chance to work outside the school community, developing work-based skills, independence and to contribute something to the life of the town.

Work Shadowina When you start your Sixth Form, many of you may not know what career path you may ultimately take. This is perfectly normal! In Year 12 you will take part in a work-shadowing scheme to allow you to experience and explore possible future career paths and employment opportunities. This is not the same as work experience, which is the experience of the workplace and generic skills for the working environment.

Nuffield Bursaries

Every year, a team of Year 12 students undertake exciting research projects at Manchester University as part of the Nuffield Bursary Scheme. The scheme pays the students an allowance, and students then deliver a presentation at the Celebration Day in November. Recently students have completed projects on Particle Physics, Medical Physics and Radiography, all of which will have a huge impact on their university applications and personal statements.

Paired Reading Programme

All of our students become mentors to pupils in main school and as a part of their Year 12 study programme become involved in the highly successful and enjoyable Year 7/8 literacy programme.

Work-shadowing is about finding out about a specific career, and because you are over 16, you are able to participate at a different level.



University Links

Our students work with university departments to extend their knowledge and understanding, and to help bridge the gap between Sixth Form and Higher Education. Universities also play an active role in your life in school.

Oxbridge & the Sutton Trust US Programme

Students achieve academic success at Chesterfield Sixth Form with many attaining grades that allow them to access the most competitive and famous universities both in the UK and America. Students are actively encouraged to aim high and every year we have students who apply and are successful in attaining a place at Oxford or Cambridge. Whilst important, in no way does this imply that other universities are less credible. It all comes down to the student's personal choice.

The Ivy House Award

The Ivy House Award brings the kind of personal and professional development usually reserved for the most senior execs, to students - at a time when it can make the biggest difference. The Award develops leadership and life skills, giving students aged 15-18 the knowledge, skills and confidence they need to step up and take ownership of their future. SUPPORT ALL THE WAY

The Sixth Form Team

We want your time at Chesterfield High School Sixth Form to be happy and productive. The Sixth Form Progress Leader, student support team and form tutors all operate in close consultation to give you the support and guidance you need with every step of your journey. And you'll meet your personal tutor Monday -Wednesday. This offers you 1-to-1 advice and guidance on a regular basis.

Well-Being

We appreciate that there are changes as you move from Year 11 into Year 12, and we want to ensure that you feel safe and secure during your time with us. The weekly Personal Development sessions are designed to offer a programme of support and insight into social influences which may impact on your individual well-being.

We are a multi-ethnic, multi-talented and multi-faith community. Assembly takes place at least once a week, and gives all of our students time to reflect on the challenging questions that life offers



DESTINATIONS

Whatever your chosen path, we will offer you the support, advice and guidance you'll need to ensure that you're able to plan carefully for your future. The vast majority of our students go direct to university, but as high level apprenticeships also become a potential means of moving into your chosen career, we will encourage you to explore all the options available, and weigh up the value, advantages and disadvantages of all routes. This means that you can start to take responsibility and make your own decisions about your future.

UCAS

You will be supported in your application to university by a team of highly qualified and very experienced staff. Your personal form tutor will work with you to plan out your application, compose your personal statement, and complete the UCAS online application form. They will advise on courses, open days and interviews.

The Sixth Form student mentor and Progress Leader will work with your personal tutor to write your reference, to reflect your abilities as a student on both an academic and personal level. Alongside your predicted grades this reference will be central in a successful application to the university of your choice. You will have access to independent and impartial careers advice and will be able to book an individual appointment to discuss possible options for your future career.

Apprenticeships

Students who are considering the apprenticeship route when they finish Sixth Form are provided with 1:1 support and guidance from Careers Connect. This includes help finding and applying for an apprenticeship, completing application forms, compiling a CV and practice interviews. They are in school on Tuesday and Thursday. All students seeking an apprenticeship will have a 1:1 meeting in Year 12, followed by further meetings in Year 13. Previous students have gained apprenticeships in Cyber security, Digital Marketing and Business Management.

Higher and Degree Apprenticeships

Higher and Degree apprenticeships are available at levels 4 to 7. They combine work with study and can include a work-based, academic or combined qualification or a professional qualification relevant to the industry.

Higher Apprenticeships go from level 4 to 7 and are equivalent to a foundation degree and above e.g. a professional qualification. Degree Apprenticeships are available at levels 6 and 7 (full bachelor's and Master's).

Higher and Degree Apprenticeships are likely to be very competitive and should not be seen as an 'easier' alternative to university. However, students are provided with support throughout the Sixth Form to ensure that they are informed and prepared for apprenticeship opportunities and vacancies when they arise.

Career North are a local Careers Company who have been providing high quality CEIAG in the North West for over 10 years. Your son/daughter will receive valuable and impartial careers advice and guidance, which will support them to make well informed decisions about their future.

Career North's Advisers are highly experienced and professionally qualified in Careers Guidance. All students will be offered the opportunity to have a one to one Career Conversation and will receive a detailed action plan to support them with their career planning. Additionally, specifically for 6th Form, Career North offer additional support through group sessions, assemblies, workshops, drop-ins and webinars covering key topics such as student finance, work experience, University accommodation, apprenticeships, CVs and covering letters, mock interview preparation, improving revision and study skills, clearing and more!

Sixth Form Open Evening

1. All students interested in joining our Sixth Form are invited to our Sixth Form Information Evening in October.

This event will give you the opportunity to find out more about the school, meet our subject specialists and most importantly find out all that you need to know about the subjects that interest you.

2. The Application Form The next stage in the process involves completing an application form where you indicate which A Level subjects you would like to study in Sixth Form.

3. Advice and Guidance Meeting We will invite you to an Advice and Guidance meeting to discuss with a senior member of the staff your future ambitions, career plans and choice of subject courses.

4. A Letter Home We will write to you to tell you whether you have been successful in securing a provisional place.

5. Pre-Enrolment Successful applicants will be invited to attend a pre-enrolment event in late June/early July. This is important, because it's where we start the preparation for your successful transition from GCSE to A Level study.

6. Results & Enrolment When you receive your GCSE results in August you complete your enrolment with us before starting your studies in September.

Entry Requirements

The following entry requirements will secure your offer of a place at Chesterfield Sixth Form. Students will need to have a good attendance record to enter the Sixth Form. They must also have an excellent behaviour record in school.

Sixth Form Dress Code

We want our Sixth Form students to be proud of their appearance, creating a positive image not just in school but also within the wider community.

We trust our Sixth Formers to use their judgement, to work with us to strike the right balance and to use common sense when choosing which clothing to wear. We ask for parents and carers to support this approach.

Students:

ALL STUDENTS ARE TO WEAR A BLACK, GREY OR NAVY SUIT INCLUDING A SUIT JACKET OR BLAZER

- Full length trousers or knee length skirts to be fitted to the waist or tailored suit dresses
- A plain black, grey, navy or pastel colour shirt with a plain tie of a subtle pattern or a smart blouse with a collar of a subtle pastel colour - vest tops, t-shirts or tops revealing much flesh are not permitted
- Jumpers may be worn in addition to the suit jacket or blas
 polo or turtle neck jumpers are not permitted
- Black, dark navy or flesh coloured tights with skirts
 patterned or fashion tights are not permitted
- Footwear should be formal and dark in colour with shoes no higher than 3 inches. Dark ankle boots can only be wor with trousers – no pumps, trainers, walking or knee length such as 'UGG' boots are permitted
- Coats are to be worn to and from school but are not to permitted within the school building – no denim, 'hoodies' or jackets with large logos are permitted Sixth Form Stude are expected to exercise mature judgement in their choic of attire.

Sixth Form Students are expected to exercise mature judgement in their choice of attire. The Headteacher has the final decision upon what is and is not suitable attire for the Sixth Form and students who arrive at school wearing items not permitted within the dress code will be asked to go home and change into suitable clothing.

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Attendance

Level 3 Qualifications are rigorous courses, therefore maintaining an excellent attendance and punctuality record is a prerequisite for academic success. Exemplary attendance for University applications, work placements or apprenticeship schemes is crucial and is therefore a priority for all Sixth Formers

During independent study periods students are expected to undertake their work. We expect students to be self-managers when it comes to their own learning and using time wisely.

Where students are flagged as being behind with their work, we will work with students and parents/carers to define a more directed and structured timetable to keep them on track for success at the end of their time in Sixth Form.

Students should not make appointments during the school day and parents are required to report any absence before 8.50am each day. Pupils are not permitted to self-certify. Any request for an absence must be completed and signed by a parent or carer. This should be handed directly to either the Year 12 or 13 Student Support Manager.

You should always be aware that poor attendance and punctuality can sometimes affect the completion of your course and could put your qualifications at risk. Where we can see problems arising though, we'll always aim to get you back on track
